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About Us

St. John's College and Chundikuli Girls' College are two of the well known educational institutions in Jaffna, Sri Lanka, which were founded by Church Missionary Society (CMS) in 1823 and 1896 respectively. The alumni of these two prestigious institutions formed the "Chundikuli Trust Fund" (CTF), a registered charity in the UK in 1984.

The CTF have been actively involved in many humanitarian projects in the past. The provision of essential food items and medicine to Tsunami victims in December 2004 is one such project.

CTF was one of the first to lend a helping hand to the parent institutions when a large number of displaced students were admitted to the schools in the aftermath of the war in 2009, by initiating the "Eagle Nest" project. The "Eagle Nest" project provides long term educational support for these children with the help of well-wishers and past pupils of the colleges. The boarders are provided with materials required for the day-to-day living and extra-curricular activities. They are provided with tuition support under the "Education support programme".

"The light for life" project supports the visually impaired students at Chundikuli and Nuffield school. Two hearing-impaired children from Nuffield school are also supported under the "Eagle Nest" programme.

The current projects also include assistance to the Support Centres in Vanni run by St. John's College. These centres provide educational support for children in formal education, and provision of vocational and self-employment training programmes.

We are thankful to our donors and well-wishers who continue to support this programme generously. Your support has been invaluable in the progress of the projects during the past year which are discussed briefly in this report.

Message from the Principal of Chundikuli Girls' College.



I have great pleasure in forwarding this message for the annual report of Chundikuli Trust Fund for the period under review.

CTF, through the Eagle Nest programme, has been very supportive of the education support programme for the internally displaced children from its inception in 2009. At present we have 10 borders and 10 day scholars supported by the Eagle Nest. The sponsorship covers their school and boarding fees, materials needed for their education, day-to-day needs and extra-curricular activities. Tuition support is provided through the education support programme to the children residing in the college hostel. Violin lessons are

also given to children interested in learning the instrument.

3 of the children supported under the 'Light for life' programme have gained admission to the Faculty of Arts, University of Jaffna. This was made possible through the sponsorship programme under which the students received all the necessary equipment and tuition support needed, in addition to the educational expenses.

Under the education support programme, hostellers are provided tuition in English and Science after school hours. In 2014, 29 hostellers sat for written English exam held by the Institute of Western Music and Speech in Sri Lanka and 24 sat for the Cambridge: YLE examinations and received very good feedback from the examiners.

The students are provided with facilities for entertainment and are taken on trips occasionally. We are very thankful to the generous sponsors who support their education, and encourage them by visiting them and writing to them.

I take this opportunity to thank the Chundikuli Trust Fund for initiating the Eagle Nest programme and I also thank the sponsors, past pupils and well – wishers for supporting these children through this programme. Your generous help has made a big difference for the better in the lives of these children.

We take this opportunity to thank the sponsors who have provided our students with the opportunity to continue their education successfully and work towards their goals and ambitions.

Our Projects

Light for Life

4 visually handicapped children at Nuffield School and Chundikuli Girls' College were supported during this period under this programme. They were provided with the materials and machines needed for their education as well as tuition support. 3 students who sat for the G.C.E A/L examination from Chundikuli Girls' College have done very well, and have gained admission to the Faculty of Arts, University of Jaffna. Another student from Nuffield who sat for the G.C.E O/L examination did very well to obtain 4 distinctions. He is following A/L classes at St. John's College at present. We thank the JWT organization, SJC_DCETF Canada and the sponsors who helped the students achieve this, by their kind donations towards the purchase of materials and machines needed.

Education Support Programme

The Education support programme, initiated as a joint project between Eagle Nest UK and PPA Canada during the latter part of 2011, continues to provide tuition support to children who require additional help.

The children at St. John's College are provided with additional tuition classes in English, Mathematics, Science and Health Science (English medium). The students at Chundikuli Girls' College are provided with English and Science tuition classes and the children at Karuna Nilayam, Kilinochchi are provided with Science tuition classes under this programme.

29 children from CGC sat for the graded written exams held by the Institute of Western music and Speech, Sri Lanka and 25 of the children obtained 50% and above. 24 children from CGC also sat for the Cambridge English: Young Learners Spoken English Examinations in 2014. They did very well as can be seen from the examiner's comments given below.

Examiners comments

"I am extremely happy to let you know that the examining session held at Chundikuli Girls School in Jaffna was extremely satisfactory.

As for the candidates, the girls were greatly enthusiastic and diligent in facing an oral exam. It showed very much that they were very well prepared and looked forward to the exam. Without a doubt their teacher has done a great job in training.

Although at certain points they seem to struggle, they were able to compile their sentences and communicate their thoughts in great manner. It was never a problem as they were within the Cambridge YLE standards. But I must also mention that there were a few who managed to speak very much at ease.

I did notice that these candidates were above the age category stated by Cambridge. The standard age band for YLE is between the ages of 7-12 yet most of these candidates were above that age category. Nevertheless I believe it is not much to worry about taking into consideration their learning abilities.

All in all they were a great bunch of very well behaved candidates who were very courteous and valued the need of learning a language."

St. John’s Support Centres

The St. John’s support Centres in Shanthapuram, Thaneeruthu & Tharmapuram in the Vanni region continue to provide Education support to the children in the surrounding areas. 8 teachers are employed in these centres and 101 children attend the after school classes funded by the CTF. In addition to the after school classes, exam oriented classes are held at SJC during vacations and special classes are held in vanni by SJC Teachers. Shramadana Trips/ Curricular & Co curricular Trips for SJC students to other districts, and providing essential needs to the needy children are also important components of the project.



Other Activities

Violin Classes

The boarders at CGC who are interested in music are given violin lessons and the girls have reached a level of proficiency which enables them to perform at the functions held at the college.

Entertainment

The children taken on trips occasionally to places of interest in and around the district. They have also been provided with games and related materials for entertainment.

Boarders' Day

The annual Boarders' Day at St. John's College and Chundikkuli Girls' College give the students at the hostels a great platform to showcase their talents, and is immensely appreciated by the school community.

Collection tins

We are very thankful to Mr. Sriram for running this project which helps pay the salaries of the coordinators. Collection tins are placed in 60 in specific business locations and we thank everyone for their contribution in the past.

St. John's Staff Quarters Project

The CTF committed to the raising of funds for the construction of two staff units at £20,000 each, and thanks to the generosity of our donors, we are extremely happy that we have achieved the target. We are extremely thankful to DR Gunam Kanagaratnam and Dr. Maheswaran who helped tremendously in raising the raising of funds.

From the drawing board to reality



Technology Faculty AT St.John's College, Jaffna.

I am writing this letter to give you an update on the Technology building and the establishment of Technology faculty by St. John's and Jaffna Academy.

Our vision is that this Technology faculty will serve not only the Students of St. John's College but the other students in the Northern Province and throughout the Island. Hence St. John's will be able to offer a valuable opportunity to the boys and girls who wish to pursue the Technology stream

In addition to providing the Technology stream our hope is one day it will be raised to university standard to award Diplomas and degrees for the Advance Level students who are eligible to enter but unable to get their admission for the University. This technology building will enable us to offer post secondary diploma and degree programs. Although there are some private institutions offering diploma/degree programs, there is a dearth of not for profit service minded educational establishments in Jaffna. We feel that St. Johns college/Jaffna Academy and the Technology building will be able to fill this void.

We were able to link with the Open University, Sri Lanka. The Vice Chancellor of open university declared open the teaching center to mark the linkage of open university with St. Johns college and Jaffna Academy. Open university is currently awarding degrees in Bachelor of Technology in Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering , Electrical Engineering , Software Engineering, Computer Engineering, Communication Engineering, Textile Engineering, Mechatronics Engineering, with three passes in the A/Level.

Some foreign universities have also expressed interest in exploring the establishment of a diploma/degree program with us. We feel that this venture will enable us to be a premier institution providing valuable educational and vocational training opportunities for the deserving youth.

- The Technology building was constructed by obtaining a loan of Rs. 30 million. Our annual obligation on this loan, including interest and principal repayment, is Rs. 5,072 million. The repayment period is for 10 years.

- We will need another 30 million to buy the necessary equipments and machineries to enable us to meet the requirements of a Technology faculty. This will also help us to link with other universities.
- We are seeking experts in the Engineering and Bio Systems Technology

I am also writing this letter to request your assistance and support in meeting our loan obligations. We thank you for the support you have given us this far. By your support, we have been able to raise Rs. 7.25 Million . We would appreciate if you could indicate your willingness to help us in this regard. Any amount will help us to defray the cost. You could make your pledge monthly, semi-annually or annually.

Independent Examiner's Report

To the Trustees of

I report on the accounts of the year ended 31 March 2015 set out on the pages one to three

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

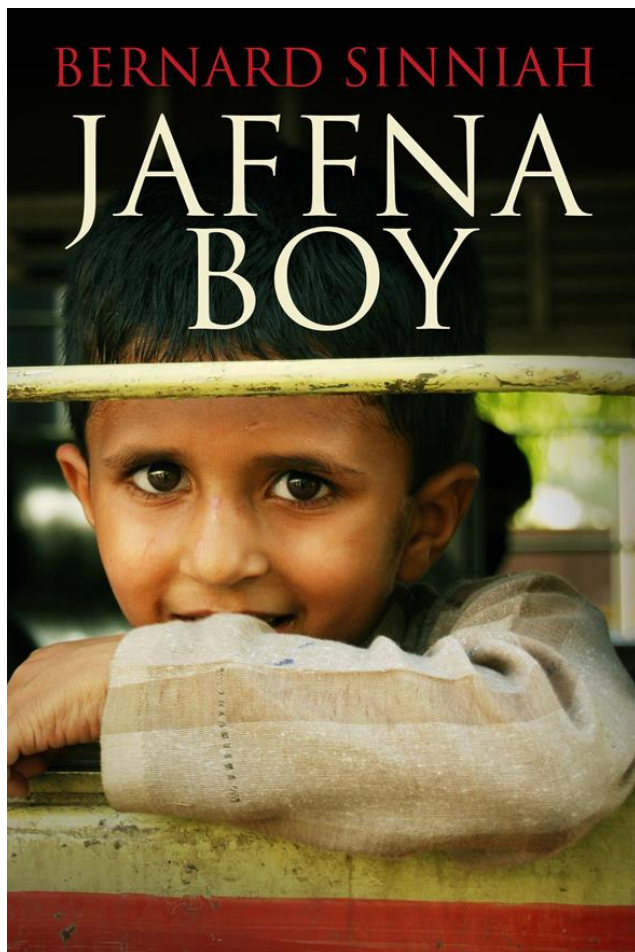
